Because of the necessary restrictions of distance we are limited in space in our Church.

I never thought I would write or say this, but I am encouraging people, as much as possible to join us for Christmas Mass on the Webcam or for those who are able from the carpark. We just do not have the space to accommodate everyone and I dread the thoughts of anyone being turned away or refused entry to Christmas Mass in your home Church. We have 3 Christmas Masses, 2 on Christmas Eve, one at 7pm and the other at 9 p.m. and our usual 11.30 a.m. on Christmas Day. The 9a.m. Mass in the Convent can only accommodate 16 people so I know you understand these necessary restrictions are to keep the Sisters safe.

On Sunday St. Stephen's Day we have 3 Masses at 9a.m, 11.30 a.m. and an extra evening Mass at 5 p.m. Perhaps a family could pick one of the 5 Masses over the two days so then every family who wishes could come to celebrate Mass for Christmas in our own Church.

This is not an easy time. In fact it is very difficult for many people. I wish it could be different. Your understanding, generosity and co-operation has been amazing. I would not have expected anything less from you the people of this parish. So let us once again continue to pray, reflect and act in such a way that all of us can have the blessing of a safe and peaceful Christmas. (Fr. Frankie)
